Lifelong Learning in a Technological World

Concept

The fourth industrial revolution is bringing a major change to our world: for the first time, machines will be making decisions for humans, and artificially intelligent agents integrated into hybrid communities, interacting with people in all walks of life. This revolution poses important epistemological and ethical questions that require attention from all educational levels. In this event, we outline its global challenges, and highlight a framework where teachers and adult learners can quickly adapt to new technologies, especially since skill sets with increasing demand will favour learning-centred qualifications with heavy cognitive loads. One enabling technology that can help support digital literacy for teachers and give them access to policy and research to support their classroom practice is BERTiE - a purpose-built online search engine for educationalists which has been created at Bath Spa Institute for Education. The presentation will look at the principles behind its development, and the challenges going forward.
