

The LLLPlatform Survey ran from 11 April to 30 September 2017. It gathered 65 responses from 27 countries.

The preliminary results were discussed during the Erasmus+ Coalition Debate on 21 November 2017, in the frame of the LLLWeek2017.

87% of respondents spent *a lot of time* on the project application - 36% said it’s too much



European networks remain the best way to find partners

50% of respondents revert to regular partners to build their consortium



Newcomers have a hard way to get in consortia

52% said the programme would benefit from synergies with **Europe for Citizens**

49% said the programme would benefit from synergies with **Creative Europe**

Synergies with other programmes

49% of respondents think funding is not adequate



77% do not believe rules are evenly applied from one National Agency to another - Last year was 34%!
