Global citizenship education for teachers

Concept

Non-formal education (NFE) providers are more and more open to cooperate with the school education sector and teacher education providers to support preparing students to live and work in a globalised world. Moreover, while the EU and its new Commission will invest more in school education, it is also keen on promoting SDGs through its programmes aimed at internationalisation of schools.
